Overview of SCAD

- In 1985, Dr Cletus Babu began Social Change And Development (SCAD) in India.
- > There are seven main areas in which SCAD support the communities:
 - Agriculture and animal husbandry
 - Community Organisation
 - Education
 - Health
 - Environmental protection
 - Disaster relief
 - Special groups, including 'orphaned elders', gypsies, and disabled individuals
- These areas work together as an integrated development plan firmly rooted on the specific needs of the community.
- SCAD facilitates changes that transform people's lives and empowers them.

Where is SCAD?

- SCAD's geographical area is located in five main regions in the southern tip of India:
 - Toothukudi, Ottapidaram, Vilathikulam, Tiruchendur and Tirunelveli.
- The map below shows more detail on the location of current SCAD initiatives.
- Our aim is to take our model GLOBALLY to help the WORLD.

How does SCAD do it?

- Integrated, long term, sustainable change and development in communities
 - Plant trees
 - Set up kitchen gardens
 - Introduce sustainable agriculture
 - Teach animal husbandry
 - Build water collection units
 - Teach women skills to support their families
 - Set up schools to educate the children
 - Set up health clinics
 - Research into environmentally sustainable agriculture
 - Disaster management
 - Help marginalised people



Trees = Sustainable Living

- Trees can satisfy all the essential needs of rural villagers
 - The provide food, animal fodder, fuel, medicine, much-needed income
- Trees also help guard against climate change and near-desert conditions
 - Trees improve soil and water retention and fertility
 - Provide shade
 - Reduce local temperatures
 - Increase the probability of rain
 - Help retain more ground water and prevent run off during Monsoon season
- Trees = Water = Sustainable Life



Take Away Facts

- > 27 years of success
 - Over 500,000 people helped to free themselves from a life of poverty
- 500 villages supported
 - 60 of 'our' villages are now completely self supporting and no longer need our help
- 100,000 trees planted annually
 - 2 SCAD nurseries growing 100,000 saplings a year
 - 15 numbers of SCAD staff training 'beneficiaries' how to plant and care for saplings
 - Trees are planted in Monsoon season (Oct to Dec)
- > 82p plants one tree
